





YOU ARE GOING TO COLLEGE

(if you want)

- There are ~1,400 colleges, half of which admit 67%+ of their applicants. Arizona/Arizona State, Gonzaga, Oregon, UC Boulder, Texas Tech, Michigan State, St. John's, Miami, Kansas, etc.
- There are only ~50 schools (3.5%) that accept < 20%. Ivies, Stanford, Duke, Northwestern, USC, UCLA, Berkeley (5 out of 9 UCs are now < 30%), etc.
- While college <u>sticker prices</u> have gone way up, the <u>actual amount families</u> <u>are paying hasn't increased that much more than inflation.</u>

- You may not need the SAT/ACT if your GPA is high and your scores are low, or if you're only applying to UCs/CSUs.
- But you may not know yet what your high score may be, or where you're applying that might require.
- It's very competitive for GPA-only apps.
- Higher acceptance rates* (and higher \$) for those submitting scores.
- Bottom line: An SAT/ACT score (especially a good one) can help set you apart.





- SCORE RAISING TIPS & TRICKS

 1) GUESS ON EVERY QUESTION... but skip some (guess quickly), and skip around!
- 2) Know how they write things: There's one RIGHT answer, and three WRONG answers. Eliminate.
- 3) Improvement has three parts: A) DO PRACTICE QUESTIONS. B) REVIEW YOUR MISTAKES. And C) LEARN FROM THESE MISTAKES, whether it's a math concept you didn't know, a grammar rule you didn't spot, or a wrong answer type you didn't notice. You'll see these SAME BASIC QUESTIONS AGAIN - that's what a STANDARDIZED test means.


